COLONEL (DR.) TRACY K. BOZUNG

Colonel Tracy K. Bozung is the Deputy Commander of the 59th Medical Wing and Wilford Hall Ambulatory Surgical Center, Joint Base San Antonio-Lackland, Texas, whose mission is to provide deployed and home station health care, graduate medical education and clinical research to enhance the Air Force mission readiness capabilities. As the Air Force's largest medical wing, the 59th Medical wing is composed of five groups, executing a \$270 million budget as part of the \$1.2 billion San Antonio Military Health System, supporting more than 255,000 eligible beneficiaries with 66,000 enrolled in our medical home. WHASC provides almost 1 million clinic visits and 19,000 surgeries annually. Additionally, the WHASC employs 5,600 military and civilian personnel, residents and students.

Colonel Bozung was the top graduate from the United States Air Force Academy in 2000. Dr. Bozung received her medical degree from the University of Michigan Medical School and her Masters of Public Health from Wright State University. She maintains board certifications in aerospace medicine and family medicine and has served as medical director for family and flight medicine clinics. Colonel Bozung was a senior physician on a joint Provincial Reconstruction Team in support of Operation Enduring Freedom and then served as the Deputy Director of the Pentagon Flight Medicine clinic. In addition to being the Chief of Aerospace Medicine at three medical facilities, she has had the honor of commanding two squadrons and two groups and serving as a command surgeon at a numbered Air Force.
